CALL FOR PAPERS: CONFERENCE ON MARKETS WITH SEARCH FRICTIONS



A call for papers for the Conference on Markets with Search Frictions on 26-28 October 2017 at The Dale T. Mortensen Center has just been announced.

The conference welcomes theoretical and empirical papers on markets with search frictions. Papers on different markets and areas of application are encouraged, including labour, money, finance, real estate, trade, industrial organisation, public economics, marriage markets, etc. Also welcome are papers on the use of register data, on labour and macro more generally, and on the associated econometric methods.

Deadline for paper submission is 31 August 2017.

The conference will take place at the <u>Aarhus Institute of Advanced Studies</u>.

LIMITED ACCES TO BLACKBOARD FROM 15 JUNE - 9 JULY



A process of merging various versions of Blackboard is carried out in the period 15 June - 9 July. This means that you have limited access to Blackboard during that period.

You can access Blackboard via a temporary URL, but you only have reading access to the system, meaning that you can find uploaded material and read messages, but if you send messages or distribute new material, then you will have to do it again after the maintenance period.


CONTAINER FOR REFUNDABLE DEPOSIT BOTTLES AND CANS
