EDUCATION NEWS FROM THE DEAN'S OFFICE



Vice-Dean for Education Per Andersen has sent out a newsletter with the latest news within the area of education. Below are some points that may be of interest to you.

• New principles for the scheduling of exams on the full-time degree programmes at Aarhus BSS

At a meeting on 6 June 2017 the faculty management team at Aarhus BSS approved a number of new principles for the scheduling of exams.

The principles have been developed on the basis of discussions among the directors of studies, heads of department, staff and student representatives as well as on the basis of input from relevant staff members in the studies administration.

Students' right to individual exams

Minister for Higher Education and Science Søren Pind has initiated a process to give students the right to take their final examinations individually.

If the student makes a final assignment in a group, the student should have the possibility of choosing to take the oral exam individually.

• A better system in relation to external co-examiners to strengthen the quality of the study programmes Based on the recommendations of the external co-examiners committee (Censorudvalget) from January 2017, Minister for Higher Education and Science Søren Pind wants to improve the system in relation to external co-examiners at the universities.

In future, the external co-examiners must be more actively involved in the universities' initiatives to improve the quality of the study programmes, and the universities must raise their demands as regards the competencies of the external co-examiners.



Aarhus University Research Foundation's (AUFF) supplementary pool provides seed funding for small-scale research activities such as analyses, field work etc. of young researchers at Aarhus BSS.

Co-funding from the relevant department is required.

The applicant must be employed at Aarhus BSS as either PhD student, post doc, assistant professor, or recently started associate professor

A grant can range between DKK 25,000 and 200,000.

The application must contain:

- A description of the planned research activities including the academic benefits/how the applied methods will contribute to the research project (max 2 pages)
- A budget for the research activities, including a description of cofunding from the department
- CV of the applicant

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.
