DKK 5 MILLION TO BASTIEN MICHEL AND MARIANNE SIMONSEN FROM TRYGFONDEN



[Bastien Michel](#) and [Marianne Simonsen](#) have received DKK 5 million from TrygFonden for their project to evaluate a therapy-based intervention specifically designed to help individuals who have grown up in a family with an alcohol problem, while relying on a randomized wait list control design.

The intervention takes the form of individual counselling and therapy, group therapy, and psychoeducational training. Its objective is to improve beneficiaries' psychological health but, in doing so, it also hopes to reduce the likelihood of behavioral problems and improve their health status, educational achievement, and connection to the labor market.

The theme is "*Et frisk pust? Globaliseringen sendt i skammekrogen?*", and the speakers are:

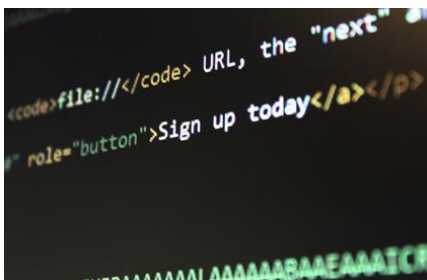

IMPROVE YOUR SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT SKILLS



Cognition and Behavior Lab and Interacting Minds Centre host two workshops aimed at helping researchers and students develop their software development skills. For many researchers, computer programming is a necessary skill enabling their research, e.g. reproducible data analysis, harvesting data from the web, solving mathematical models, performing simulations, developing analysis methods or algorithms, developing software for behavioural experiments and much more.

Two workshops will be held in October: [Software Carpentry](#) (9–10 October) and [Code Refinery](#) (24–26 October).

You can join one or both, depending on your needs and skills.

The Software Carpentry workshop is aimed at beginners who have limited programming experience, and would like some foundational skills and good habits to enable them to become better programmers. The topics taught are Unix shell, Python and version control with Git.

Code Refinery is for researchers and students who have experience writing code, and would like to improve their skills by learning some more advanced techniques. If you already attended a Software Carpentry workshop or have the skills taught there, you are ready for Code Refinery.

Both workshops are open to researchers from all disciplines and are free of charge.

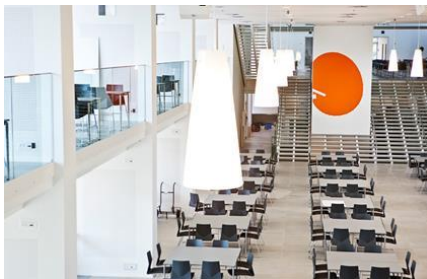

RESEARCHPROFESSIONAL - SET UP YOUR OWN ACCOUNT



All researchers at the Department interested in seeking research funding are advised to set up a profile at [Researchprofessional.com](https://www.researchprofessional.com). Researchprofessional is a continually updated database containing information on calls and funding opportunities from all sources, including EU and Denmark.

To get access also to institutional postings, you have to set up your profile while being on the premises of AU.

The programme contains many nice features, including email alerts on funding opportunities, and you choose which specific area you would like to receive e-mail alerts about.

How to search for funding opportunities: Go to Advanced Search and search under Discipline, write e.g. Economics, press Search and choose your subfield, press Update. Choose Award Type and choose the type of award you are looking for, and press Update and then Search - For example, to look for all calls for post-doc fellowships in Health Economics.

You can save your searches in your profile area, ask for weekly emails on offerings etc. You can also go into the institution tailored sub-page, Aarhus University, where you find calls that AU has put together.

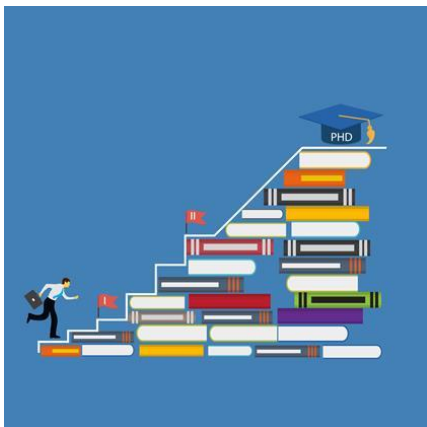
