STAFF PORTRAIT

STAFF PORTRAIT: EVELYN BRAUMANN



<u>Evelyn Braumann</u> has been so kind as to answer some questions about herself and her work. Thank you, Evelyn! Evelyn is assistant professor at the Department and is located in building 2632(L), office 207.

How long have you been employed at the Department of Economics and Business Economics?

I joined the Department on the first of August, about three months now.

What is your background?

A mix of practice and academia. After finishing my Master in International Economics, I worked for about five years in audit and risk management advisory in Vienna, but I never lost the idea of getting back to the university. Thus, I finally started my PhD in Accounting at WU Vienna in 2012, graduating in spring 2017.

What are your main areas of research?

Influenced by my previous experience in the industry, my research focuses on risk management, corporate governance, and management control.

What research projects are you working on at the moment?

Currently, I'm working on three main projects: 1) getting my thesis papers published, which focus on various topics of enterprise risk management implementation in nonfinancial firms, 2) exploring risk management and control practices in small- and medium-sized companies, together with a former colleague from Vienna, 3) investigating the synergies between corporate sustainability and enterprise risk management in US nonfinancial firms, together with three colleagues at NC State - where I spent one year during my PhD.

What are you involved in teaching-wise at the moment?

Financial accounting for HA/BSc-students.

Are you planning to take part in any conferences or the like abroad in the near future?

I am. I just booked my tickets to Scottsdale, for the Management Accounting Section Meeting taking place at the beginning of next year.

Are you expecting any visiting researchers from abroad in the near future (or have you had any visitors from abroad recently)?

Last year, I helped organizing a risk management conference in Vienna hosted by the Austrian Association of Management Accountings. I invited two US colleagues for a talk.

Are you cooperating with researchers from other departments at AU at the moment?

Not yet. But I'm open for that.

What do you do when you are not at work?

I love traveling! :-)

Then, I do a lot of Yoga - I'm a certified Yoga teacher. I used to teach, but I have not found a proper place here in Aarhus yet. Same with Tennis: I used to play tournaments, now looking for a new club.

In general I like all sorts of sports and activities.. Furthermore, movies, coffee and baking...
