# New research project: HPCFinance – with funding from the European Commission

Peter Løchte Jørgensen is taking part in a research project that has just received a major grant from the European Commission. The research group from AU that Peter Løchte Jørgensen is part of is one of 7 main partners (4 universities and 3 companies) in a research project entitled "Training in Modern Quantitative Methods and High-Performance

Computing for Finance", HPCFinance in short. There is an additional 8 associated partners (3 universities and 5 companies) who participate in the project. The project has received funding from the European Commission/REA, and the full budget is EUR 4,101,000 of which AU will receive EUR 890,000. AUs share will mainly be used to host and fund 3 of the project's 12 Early Stage Researchers (ESRs), i.e. PhD students. Locally responsible people are Peter Løchte Jørgensen with a lot of help from the former Finance Research Group and particularly Elisa Nicolato and David Skovmand. # Philipp Schröder in newly appointed Productivity Commission

<u>Philipp Schröder</u> has just been appointed to the Government's new Productivity Commission of independent experts who are to come up with ideas as to how the productivity in Denmark can be strengthened. Minister for Economic Affairs and the Interior, Margrethe Vestager says that the Government wishes to set the frames for a strong development in productivity, which is crucial if Denmark is to remain one of the richest countries in the

# Holidays - guidelines

Employees who have been employed during the whole calendar year are entitled to **25 "ordinary" holidays and 5 "special" holidays**. The holiday

must be taken in the subsequent holiday year, which runs from 1 May to 30 April.

- 20 days of holiday must be taken
- 5 days of holiday can be taken, transferred to the next holiday year or paid out
- 5 "special" holidays can be taken, transferred to the next holiday year or paid out.

#### General guidelines on remaining holidays

Remaining "special holidays" and no more than 5 remaining "ordinary" holidays may be transferred to the next holiday year. Transfer of remaining holidays requires a written agreement with the head of department (VIPs) or the head of secretariat (TAPs), and at the same time a plan stating when the transferred remaining holidays are to be taken must be made. The agreement must be made no later than 29 June this year.

#### What to do if you want to receive money instead of your special holidays?

If you have remaining "special holidays", it will be assumed that you wish to have them paid out. To have your remaining "special holidays" paid out, you need to fill in the form "Pay out of special holidays" found below – before 29 June.

# What to do if I want to transfer my remaining "special" holidays

If you do not wish to have your remaining "special" holidays paid out, but want them transferred to the next holiday year, you should fill in the form "Transfer of remaining holiday" below – before 29 June.

# What if I have been absent from work for a longer time during the previous year?

Pay out of more than 5 remaining "ordinary holidays" may only take place in special circumstances (i.e. illness, maternity/paternity leave). This requires that a written agreement is made with the head of department (VIPs) or head of secretariat (TAPs). The agreement must be made before 29 June this year.

#### Do I have any remaining holidays?

If you are in doubt as to whether you have any remaining holidays for the holiday year 2011/2012, or if you have questions regarding your holiday, you should contact <a href="Margit Sommer">Margit Sommer</a> (8000c) or <a href="Ingrid Lautrup">Ingrid Lautrup</a> (Hermodsvej and Fuglesangs Allé).

#### Registration of "standard holiday"

According to "standard agreement", unless stated otherwise by the employee, 4 weeks holiday during the summer and 2 weeks holiday during the winter will be registered by the Department on 7 December and 7 April, respectively. This is to make sure that all holidays are registered for all employees. If you wish to change this, you should contact <a href="Margit Sommer">Margit Sommer</a> (8000c) or <a href="Ingrid Lautrup">Ingrid Lautrup</a> (Hermodsvej and Fuglesangs Allé) stating when you would like to take your holidays.

Please note that this is done in order to comply with the procedure set forth by the National Auditors (Rigsrevisionen) and to follow the instructions regarding holiday registration set forth by the BSS Cooperation Committee.

# The Technology Transfer Office offers counselling to researchers

When communication with private companies, public authorities, other research institutions or sponsors about research contracts, research collaboration or inventions etc., researchers often run into challenges that can be difficult to overcome. The <a href="Technology Transfer Office">Technology Transfer Office</a> (TTO) at AU offers support and counselling to researchers in connection with research collaboration and patentable inventions, and it may be a good idea to consult TTO before engaging in e.g. research collaborations with other organisations.

TTO now offers a number of activities in order to make sure that researchers at AU are aware of the services provided by TTO:

- Short general presentations (10-15 minutes) at department meetings and the like
- Workshop/seminars (2-3 hours) for individual research groups with focus on topics relevant to the particular research group (e.g. collaboration with private companies, contracts etc.)
- Support to individual researchers in connection with specific activities


