FOUR ECON PHD STUDENTS CAME 3RD AT THE 20TH ECONOMETRIC GAME



On 10-12 April 2019, the 20th Econometric Game ("The World Championship in Econometrics") was held in Amsterdam. The Aarhus University team was represented by PhD students: <u>Alexander Fischer</u>, <u>Mathias Wagner Barløse</u>, <u>Nicolaj Nørgaard Mühlbach</u> and <u>Jorge Wolfgang Hansen</u>.

After many hours of tireless work, the team was awarded a third place, just behind University of Melbourne and Maastricht University.

30 teams representing universities from around the world participated in the Econometric Game.

The overall theme for this year's competition was Climate Econometrics specifically the question of which emission scenarious are congruent with a given aim for atmospheric concentrations and thus, eventually, global temperatures.

SANNE WØHLK RECEIVES FUNDING FOR SDG NETWORK



Professor <u>Sanne Wøhlk</u> has received a grant of DKK 1 million from the University Management's strategic funds for a two-year SDG (Sustainable Development Goals) network entitled "Overcoming the Challenges of a Circular Economy".

The network comprises 25 researchers from six departments and three faculties – nine of the researchers are external partners.

The network addresses two of UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals: No. 11 Sustainable cities and communities and No. 12 Responsible production and consumption, and also touches upon a number of the other goals. The final aim of the network is thus, of course, to produce future research that holds a potential for achieving these SDGs. They also hope to be able to attract more national and international funding in order to ensure the continuation of the network after the two-year period, and they will work to make AU a globally leading research institution within the field of circular economy, including waste recycling and re-valuation.

COPENHAGENMACRO DAYS





Applications should demonstrate a connection to "interacting minds".
