SASHKA DIMOVA AWARDED ELITEFORSK TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIP



PhD student [Sashka Dimova](#) is one among 20 young research talents who have received an EliteForsk travel scholarship of DKK 300,000. The scholarship is intended to help young research talents to go on long-term research stays at universities offering world-class research environments within their fields.

Sashka is hoping to spend six months at the Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J-PAL) – a research centre at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), which is spearheading some of the most innovative labour market research initiatives. She hopes to use her research to answer questions such as how labour market policies impact pay formation and unemployment, to which extent case workers contribute to creating jobs, and whether the increase in the number of people finding jobs by participating in meetings prevents others from finding a job.

PREBEN BO MORTENSEN HONOURED BY CODAN AND SEB



Codan and SEB Pension has awarded Professor [Preben Bo Mortensen](#) the 2013 price of honour followed by 100,000 DKK for his research within the fields of mental illnesses such as schizophrenia, mania, depression and autism, focusing on how a persons' genetic disposition and the environment affect the development of these types of illnesses.

Preben Bo Mortensen has used extensive population based data from the national Danish registers combined with biological samples taken from the heels of all Danish infants since 1970 to study the correlation between genetics, environment and the development of mental illness. The research is aimed at finding better ways to prevent, avoid and treat mental illnesses in the future.

ERIC HILLEBRAND AWARDED MARIE CURIE CAREER INTEGRATION GRANT



[Eric Hillebrand](#), CREATES, has been awarded a [Marie Curie Career Integration Grant](#) of DKK 750,000 for his research that takes its point of departure in the fact that decision makers at central banks, government and financial institutions, and academia are inundated by economic data nowadays. Time series from different sources, at different levels of accuracy and aggregation are available. His research aims at a class of models that extracts a small number of driving factors out of large data sets in order to enable decision makers to compute forecasts from a small tractable set of factors. These dynamic factor models usually extract the factors out of the right-hand side predictors in a regression equation, but are blind to what determines the variation in the forecast target on the left-hand side. The research aims at pursuing a strategy that has been proposed in earlier work ([Hillebrand, Lee, Li, and Huang 2012, CREATES working paper RP2012-17](#)) to “supervise” the selection of the factors with regard to the forecast target. An important application of the method is forecast models for output growth and inflation using information in the yield curve, an issue at the forefront of the current Euro crisis.
