# LECTURE AT ROSKILDE UNIVERSITY: "CHINESE BUSINESS AND AFRICAN DEVELOPMENT"



The Global Dynamics research initiative invites you to a lecture by Professor of Development and Comparative Politics at John Hopkins University, Deborah Brautigam, entitled "Chinese business and African development: the 'flying geese' model at work in Ethiopia's leather sector."

The lecture will be held on 26 November from 13:15 to 15 at Roskilde University, Auditorium 25.2.

The talk discusses how a decade ago, Ethiopian leather shoe producers were hit by a "China shock": a sharp rise in competition from cheap, imported shoes. Against conventional wisdom, the Ethiopian government opted for industrial policies, setting an export tariff on raw skins and hides, and building institutions to support leather sector investors. In 2008/09, export-oriented investment from China, as well as Europe and India, began to flow into Ethiopia's leather sector. Is Ethiopia catching the first "geese" to fly to Africa from Asia? Or is the promise of industrial policy headed for another disappointment?

This time <u>Andrea Barletta</u> has agreed to answer the questions for the staff portrait. Thank you, Andrea. Andrea is PhD student at the Department.

**How long have you been employed at the Department of Economics and Business?** 6 months

What is your background? Mathematics

What are your main areas of research?

What do you expect will be the biggest difference between being a PhD student and being a regular student?

Even though you have some duties in both cases, when you are a PhD student you basically decide how to split your work. On the other hand, when you are a regular student you have less responsibility since you are not asked to bring any results.

#### What was your first impression of the department and your new colleagues?

My first impression of this department was amazing: I literally could not believe what I was seeing, concerning the structure and more generally concerning study/work conditions. Moreover, people here are really open and always available for a chat, and what really impressed me the most is the fact that everyone here is placed at the same level - so maybe you could even end up talking with a Nobel prize laureate. My first impression is being confirmed again and again.

#### What do you do when you are not at work?

Sport and extra work are my favourite activities, but here in Denmark, and especially in Aarhus, even a simple walk can be a good investment of your free time. This is partially due to the several green areas placed throughout the city, but also partially to the Danish culture which allows you to stay in a clean and comfortable environment. Apart from that I find that Aarhus has a perfect night life since it is not so small that is lifeless, but not so big that it is chaotic.

Supplementary question from time Francesco Violante: What impressed you the most and what did you hate the most about Denmark (in the sense of culture, places, weather, people, work environment...your choice) since you got here?

No doubts concerning the second point: the weather is most likely the only thing I can't get used to here in Denmark, but this would be a common issue in every country since I come from Italy. On the contrary, it is rather hard to make a choice concerning what I like most, though I believe that "girls" would definitely be the right answer, even more than "work environment". Hoping that my girlfriend won't read it...
