The YDUN (Younger women Devoted to a UNiversity career) will be giving out DKK 110 million to female and male research grant applicants at the associate professor level.

The programme is open to all disciplines. Males may apply but preference will be given to the female candidate if a female and a male candidate possess identical qualifications.

The YDUN programme is only offered once, and the application deadline is 1 May.

## 25 AIAS-COFUND (MARIE CURIE) FELLOWSHIPS AVAILABLE



Aarhus Institute of Advanced Studies (AIAS) has opened for applications for up to 25 AIAS-COFUND Fellowships for talented researchers in the first round of applications.

There are two types of AIAS-COFUND Fellowship:Ÿ

- AIAS-COFUND Junior Fellowships (a duration of 12 to 36 months): postdoctoral research careers of 2-10 years.
- Ÿ AIAS-COFUND Senior Fellowships (a duration of 6 to 18 months): postdoctoral research careers of +10 years.

The target group of the programme is talented researchers with at least two years of fulltime experience after completing their PhD.

Applicants can choose their research topic freely within all academic areas.

Eligible applicants must comply with the following mobility demands:

- Incoming fellowships: Open for non-residents of Denmark. At the time
  of the deadline, applicants shall not have resided or carried out their
  main activity (work, studies etc.) in Denmark for more than 12
  months in the 3 years immediately prior to the deadline.
- Reintegration fellowships: Open for European researchers returning to Denmark from a country outside the European Union. At the time of the deadline, applicants shall not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies etc.) in Denmark for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately prior to the deadline.

A fellowship includes funds for travel, research expenses and a competitive salary.
