SEED MONEY FROM RETHINKIMPACTS 2017 TO RESEARCH PROJECT AT THE DEPARTMENT



A research project led by <u>Kristina Risom Jespersen</u> entitled "Measuring the economic spill-over from the creative industry" has been granted seed money from rethinkIMPACTS 2017.

The project aims at developing a measurement tool of the spill-over potential from the creative industry to other industries. The project approaches creative industries based on the people employed. Based on the Danish register data an index of company creativity has been developed that is formed on the human capital creative capabilities, and this index has been linked to company performance and economic variables.

The project is one of nine projects that received money from rethinkIMPACTS 2017. The total amount of money granted was DKK 900.000.

The International Academic Staff service at AU offers a preparatory Chinese course for AU researchers and administrative staff who are going to China or doing research related to China.


The aim of the course is to help participants achieving oral language competencies - understanding a simple conversation in Chinese, and eventually speaking simple Chinese.
