

HORIZON 2020 GRANT



CREATES members <u>Kim Christensen</u>, <u>Asqer Lunde</u>, and <u>Niels Haldrup</u> have received an ERC Horizon 2020 grant on "BigDataFinance" within the ITN (Innovative Training Networks) programme.

The grant includes a number of international academic and business partners and amounts to a total of Euros 3.5 million of which Euros 550.000 have been distributed to CREATES.

EVACUATION



Following the bomb threat towards the Department last month, it has been decided to change our evacuation procedure so that it conforms to AU's guidelines regarding evacuation.

Evacuation procedure

Any employee can (and should) assume the role of evacuation leader or meeting point manager in the event of an emergency evacuation.

Evacuation boxes containing evacuation vests and instructions for the evacuation leader and meeting point manager are located in all the Department's office buildings (see map):

- Building 2621(B)
- Building 2622(C) Ground floor
- Building 2622(C) 1st floor
- Building 2622(C) 2nd floor
- Building 2628(M) 3rd floor
- Building 2630/2631(K)
- Building 2632(L) Ground floor
- Building 2632(L) 1st floor

All employees must make sure that they know where the nearest evacuation box is located.

The evacuation leader must:

- clear the area of people
- put on the yellow vest
- follow the instructions on the yellow instruction sheet

The meeting point manager must:

- receive the evacuated people at the meeting point
- put on the orange vest
- follow the instructions on the orange instruction sheet

There are two meeting points:

- In front of the main entrance between buildings 2631(K) and 2632(L).
- The parking area behind building 2636(U).

Employees must go to the meeting point that is closest to their building.

There should be an evacuation leader for each of the evacuation areas mentioned above, and a meeting point manager for each of the meeting points.

STAFF PORTRAIT: KIM ALLAN ANDERSEN



This time <u>Kim Allan Andersen</u> has agreed to answer the questions for the staff portrait. Thank you, Kim Allan. Kim Allan is professor at the Department.

How long have you been employed at the Department of Economics and Business Economics?

I started at the former business school in August 2003. Before that, I was employed for several years at Department of Mathematics.

What is your background?

I have a Master's degree in Mathematics-Economics (1984) and a PhD in Operations Research (1990). Between my Master's degree and my PhD, I worked fulltime in an IT company for a couple of years (including part-time employment I worked for the company for six years).

What are your main areas of research?

Operations Research. I have worked with several topics in operations research and logistics throughout the years, in particular logical inference, integer programming, location theory and multicriteria optimization.

What research projects are you working on at the moment?

I am working on the following research projects:

- Developing exact methods for multicriteria optimization. In particular, I am working on developing a parallel branch and bound algorithm.
- Bicriteria stochastic knapsack problems.
- Supply chain network design for biomass.

What are you involved in teaching-wise at the moment?

Teaching in the Master programme in logistics and supply chain management, and supervising (mostly master theses).

Are you planning to take part in any conferences or the like abroad in the near future?

In June I am attending a workshop on Multicriteria Optimization in Nantes, France. In July I will attend the ISMP 2015 (International Symposium on Mathematical Programming) in Pittsburgh, PA.

Are you expecting any visiting researchers from abroad in the near future (or have you had any visitors from abroad recently)?

I expect no visitors in the near future.

Are you cooperating with researchers from other departments at AU at the moment?

I am cooperating with two colleagues at Department of Mathematics.

What do you do when you are not at work?

I do physical training at least five times each week, mostly running (these days quite slowly, I am afraid), but also fitness and walking. I go fishing (seatrout/salmon), and I like to read novels.
