RUNE VEJLIN RECEIVES AUFF STARTING GRANT



<u>Rune Veilin</u> has received an Associate Professor Starting Grant of DKK 1,441,000 from the Aarhus University Research Foundation (AUFF) for his project on income inequality.

Income inequality in Denmark has been rising over the past three decades, as it has in most industrialized countries, and the project will investigate whether changes in labor market sorting, i.e., the matching of worker types to firm types implemented by the labor market, has contributed to rising wage inequality. The basic idea is that if high wage workers and high wage firms are more likely to form a match today than previously, then wage inequality will automatically increase.

BEHAVIOURAL ECONOMICS INFRASTRUCTURE ON THE NEW DANISH ROADMAP



The Behaviour, Interaction and Cognition Labs' (BICLabs) proposal to expand and improve lab infrastructure to study human behaviour has been added to the new <u>Danish roadmap for research infrastructure</u> that was announced on 18 December 2015.

BICLabs is lead by Aarhus University, and the <u>Cognition and Behavior Lab</u> at Aarhus BSS is a crucial part of the proposed infrastructure. If realized, the BICLabs infrastructure will result in an upgrade and improvement of the existing local facilities as well as access to expertise and equipment at other labs in Denmark.

Other partners include Copenhagen University, Copenhagen Business School, University of Southern Denmark, Technical University of Denmark, and various industry partners including the LEGO Foundation.

- Link check: The reading list will be checked with respect to links to articles in electronic journals or e-books.
- Bibliographic information: The reading list will be homogenized so that all references receive a consistent output style.

When submitting your reading list to the library, the library will guarantee that your reading list complies with the copyright rules. If you do not submit your reading list to the library, you as a lecturer are responsible for complying with the copyright rules.
