## DAN MØNSTER WINS BEST PAPER AWARD AT COMPLEXIS 2016



The paper "Inferring Causality from Noisy Time Series Data" was presented by Assistant Professor <u>Dan Mønster</u> at the 1st International Conference on Complex Information Systems in Rome, and won the best paper award.

The paper is co-authored with colleagues from Interacting Minds Centre and Department of Physics and Astronomy and presents a rigorous test and new insights into using a new causality measure for time series data called convergent cross-mapping.

## **BACKUP - REDIRECTED FOLDERS**



BSS IT Support has made the following guide regarding backup:

For Windows computers IT Support offers a solution called redirected folders/offline files: Files saved in specific folders on your computer are redirected. The files are placed on AU's fileserver, and if you are not at AU, your computer will have an offline version of the file available that you can access and edit. When your computer again has access to AU's network, the files you have changed while being away from campus will be synched to the server.

## Pros:

Files are always available and they auto-backup through AUs servers every time your pc is at  ${\sf AU}$ 

#### Cons:

Slower logon times because files are being synched with AU servers

A shadow copy (previous versions) of your files on the server is created several times a day and is kept for 100 days. If you accidentally delete a file on AU's fileserver you can restore it yourself, within THE 100 days:

## How to restore files

Your computer is eligible for redirected folders if it is in the UNI domain. If your pc is in the old ASB or SAMF domain, your pc will need a reinstallation. A

reinstallation can be done on a day-to-day basis, please contact Aarhus BSS IT Support to arrange this.

# STAFF PORTRAIT

## STAFF PORTRAIT: SASHKA DIMOVA



This time <u>Sashka Dimova</u> has agreed to answer the questions for the staff portrait. Thank you, Sashka. Sashka is postdoc at the Department.

# How long have you been employed at the Department of Economics and Business Economics?

I joined the Department in September 2011 as a PhD student. Following my PhD degree, I became employed as a postdoc researcher at the Department, and I am affiliated with TrygFonden's Centre for Child Research.

### What is your background?

I obtained my PhD degree in Economics in 2014 from Aarhus University and I also hold two Master degrees in Economics; one from University of Vienna and one from the Central European University, both obtained in 2011.

## What are your main areas of research?

My research is in the fields of applied microeconometrics, education economics,

labor economics and programme evaluation with a special focus on the role of how early life inputs affect later life health, employment and wealth.

#### What research projects are you working on at the moment?

I study the effect of parental job loss on children. The detrimental effects of job loss potentially extend to children in the household, but little research has investigated such effects. My other ongoing projects include: research on the effect of parental mortality on children's education outcome joint with Nabanita Datta Gupta and Wiji Arulampalam from Warwick University; and research on the age at migration and juvenile criminal behaviour joint with Fatma Usheva and Tommaso Fattini from University of Milan.

#### What are you involved in teaching-wise at the moment?

I teach Economics to bachelor students in marketing and management communication.

# Are you expecting any visiting researchers from abroad in the near future (or have you had any visitors from abroad recently)?

Fatma Usheva, a PhD student from University of Milan is visiting for 6 months. We work together on crime and migration. We use Danish data to see to what extent disproportionate exposure to socio-economic problems and/or violence in the country of origin may play a role for the process of criminal capital accumulation.

#### What do you do when you are not at work?

I try to devote some time to exercise, reading, and checking out some podcasts. What I enjoy the most is traveling and spending time with family and friends.

CALL: THE NORDIC GREEN GROWTH RESEARCH AND INNOVATION PROGRAMME



The main research and innovation funders in the Nordic countries are launching a joint Nordic Green Growth Research and Innovation Programme in cooperation with NordForsk, Nordic Innovation and Nordic Energy Research.

The programme will cover innovation, research and energy, as well as science and technology and aims to generate Nordic added value and create synergies with relevant initiatives nationally and at the Nordic level.

The total budget amounts to NOK 73 million.

The call consists of two separate modules. Proposals for projects led by research institutions should be submitted under  $\underline{\text{Module I}}$ .

You can apply for funding ranging from NOK 10 to 20 million.


