READING LIST SERVICE



All lecturers are encouraged to make use of the AU Library's Reading List Service (*Pensumservice*) before publishing reading lists in Blackboard.

The reading list service consists of the following elements:

- The library checks the reading list with respect to copyright: The syllabus list will be reviewed and checked in relation to agreements with Copydan Writing and licensing contracts with Danish and international publishers.
- There is a new Copydan Writing agreement in pipeline which takes effect as from 1 January 2017. For teaching purposes you are allowed to copy 20% or max. 50 pages from printed books and printed journals.

- Link check: The reading list will be checked with respect to links to articles in electronic journals and e-books.
- Bibliographic information: The reading list will be homogenized so that all references get a consistent output style.

When submitting your reading list to the library, the library will guarantee that your reading list complies with the copyright rules. If you do not submit your reading list to the library, you as a lecturer are responsible for complying with the copyright rules.

INFORMATION ABOUT MARKING AT EXAMS



BSS Studies have sent out the following new guidelines regarding marking at exams:

Co-examiners and examiners must mark numerically from -3 to 12 and B/I (Passed/Not Passed). The mark -3 should only be given if a student has submitted a written exam paper which, in terms of academic content, corresponds to the mark -3. An exam paper which has been uploaded to the wrong exam flow must also be marked -3.

As from the winter exams 2016-17, examiners must on a few occasions type administrative marks (in WISEflow, STADS-VIP or paper based grade reports).

The changes came into force on 1 December 2016.

CALLS FROM THE DANISH COUNCIL FOR INDEPENDENT RESEARCH



The Danish Council for Independent Research, Social Sciences, will be accepting applications for DFF-International Postdoctoral Grants, Sapere Aude DFF-Starting Grants and International Research Stays with deadline 30 March 2017 at 16:00.

The DFF-International Postdoctoral Grant is aimed at researchers at the start of their careers, i.e. within -6 months to +3 years of completing their PhD at the time of application. The funds are given for two-year post doc studies at an international host institution of which 6 months are spent (either at the start or end of the period) at a Danish research institution.

The Sapere Aude DFF-Starting Grant is aimed at researchers who are within 8 years of completing their PhD and who have demonstrated an ability to carry out research at a high international level. A max of DKK 4.1 million excluding overhead can be applied for.

International Research stays of minimum 3 months duration may be applied for by post-PhD researchers and for an amount up to DKK 300,000, excluding overhead.
