LAST CHANCE FOR APPLICATIONS TO DFF



This is to remind you of the late summer deadlines if you want to get your hands on some of the DKK 1.1 billion that the Danish Council for Independent Research is giving out in 2012. See the calls and deadlines here.

NEW PUBLICATION CRITERIA FOR APPROVAL OF FSE-FINANCED PROJECTS

Since 2009, FSE and the other research councils have been withholding 15 % of the grant until the final budget and grant output have been approved. In future the publication criteria for achieving grant approval will be that the papers generated by the grant are either accepted for publication or have been granted a revise-and-resubmit not later than 6 months after the grant period expires.

ARE YOU PLANNING TO APPLY FOR A POSTDOC GRANT?

The Research Support Office hosts two information meetings about postdoc applications to the Danish Council for Independent Research. The purpose of the meetings is to give applicants a more solid understanding of evaluation criteria, methodical approach and the structure of a successful proposal.

If you consider applying for a postdoc position and you did not have the chance to participate in the ECON workshop in June, you are encouraged to participate in this workshop instead which is joint for FKK and FSE.

AUSTRALIAN ENDEAVOUR AWARDS 2013



The Endeavour Awards is the Australian Government's internationally competitive, merit-based scholarship programme providing opportunities for citizens of the Asia-Pacific, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas to undertake study, research and professional development in Australia. There are three types of awards that you may apply for:

- Endeavour Executive Awards provide up to AUD\$18,500 for mid-career faculty and administrators to undertake 1-3 months of professional development in Australia.
- Endeavour Research Fellowships provide up to AUS\$23,500 for postgraduate research students and postdoctoral researchers to undertake 4-6 months of research in Australia.
- Endeavour Postgraduate Awards provide up to AUD\$228,500 (PhD) and \$118,500 (Masters) for Postgraduate study/research for an Australian Master's degree (up to 2 years) or PhD (up to 4 years).
