#### **FULBRIGHT GRANTS**



Fulbright Denmark calls for applications for the following grants:

#### • Fulbright Danish Visiting Scholar

Postdocs, assistant professors, associate professors and professors who are planning a research and teaching stay in the US in 2020-2021 can apply for this grant of DKK 200,000. The stay must be for one or two semesters (4-10 months).

#### • Fulbright Danish Student

Master's and PhD students who are planning a research stay in the US in 2020-2021 can apply for this grant. You can apply for DKK 50,000 for one semester, or DKK 85,000 for the whole academic year.

Deadline for applications for both grants is 4 March 2020 at 12 noon. Applicants must be Danish citizens.
