NEWS FROM BSS FINANCE



New procedure

BSS Finance has implemented a new procedure for handling receipts when your expenses are to be covered by EU-grants and other grants where it is required that original receipts are kept in an archive.

This means that as from 1 June 2014 you must send the original receipts to AU's accounting department when your travelling expenses or other expenses are to be covered by an EU-grant (or other grants where it is required that original receipts are kept in an archive).

Your expense claim will not be approved before AU's accounting department has received your original receipts. Read more.
