AU IS SWITCHING FROM PRIORITY POST(A) TO ECONOMY POST(B)



As from 1 January 2016 all letters at AU will be sent by economy (B) post. This is due to price increases at Post Danmark.

This means that a letter will be delivered no later than four days after it has been sent, instead of the following business day.

AU's internal mail service handles franking of all letters. If it is absolutely necessary that your letter is delivered the day after it is sent, you must indicate that your letter should be sent by priority post by writing the letter 'A' at the top center of the front of the envelope.
