Successful premiere of 'Gymnasielærer-dagen' 2012

On Monday 16 January, 92 teachers from high schools and business colleges from across the country were gathered at 'Gymnasielærer-dagen 2012' ('High School Teacher's Day') at the Department of Economics and Business. The program for the day was entitled 'The Globalised International Community' and included seven employees giving presentations about various consequences of globalisation. The idea behind 'Gymnasielærer-dagen' is to create a launch pad to strengthen the co-operation with the high schools and business colleges and to communicate the new research of the department to the teachers at first hand, which will ultimately be passed on to their pupils, who one day may become students at the department. Most of the participants left the event with a smile after having been professionally updated and inspired to pass on their newly gained knowledge to their students, and several participants made sure to request a similar event next year. Jan Bentzen in climate friendly project



[Professor Jan Bentzen](#) is taking part in a Danida financed development research project entitled 'Sustainable production of biogas from waste rice straw'. Department of Bioscience AU, and Cantho University, Vietnam are also contributing to the project. The project proposes a simple and low-cost biotechnological process for the conversion of waste rice straw into biogas. It is proposed that microbial fermentation of waste rice straw could become a significant supplementary energy source in rice producing regions in Asia. If experimental proof-of-concept is obtained this could lead to a substantial increase in construction of small biogas digesters in rice producing regions thus greatly reducing the demand for fossil fuels and creating possibilities for new jobs and small enterprises. Consequently this will allow for a substantial increase in energy production and standard of living in rural areas – although in a climate friendly way.

Erasmus grants for employees

All employees at Aarhus University have the opportunity to apply for an Erasmus grant in connection with a stay abroad. You may apply for a grant for two types of stays: a teaching stay and/or a training stay. The grant is approx. 650 Euro per stay. The application deadline is 1 March (for a stay within the period 1 June 2012 – 30 September 2012). [Read more](#).

FUHU's business researcher award 2012 (FUHU's Erhvervsforskerpris 2012)

The Danish Society for the Advancement of Business Education, FUHU, now calls for nominations for the business researcher prize 2012 ([Erhvervsforskerpris 2012](#)). The prize is given to a business researcher or a group of business researchers who have produced particularly excellent results that have benefitted the competitiveness of Danish companies. The prize amounts to DKK 250,000 and must be spent on studies abroad that will enhance the dissemination of research in Denmark. Nominations must be sent by the head of department to the dean's office before 23 February 2012. [See call](#) (in Danish).

The Tietgen Prize 2012

The Danish Society for the Advancement of Business Education, FUHU, calls for nominations for the Tietgen Prize 2012. As an acknowledgement of significant research carried out by young researchers, the DKK 100,000 prize is awarded to post-doctoral researchers, i.e. assistant professors or young associate professors with no more than five years of research experience since acquiring their PhD or a similar degree. The prize may also be given to a group of researchers. The research must have been published

between 1 January 2010 and 1 January 2012. The prize must be spent on studies abroad or a research project administered by the recipient's own university. Nominations must be sent by the head of department to the dean's office before 23 February 2012. [See call](#) (in Danish).
