## NEW HOLIDAY RULES



A new holiday act will enter into force in Denmark on 1 September 2020, which means that all employees will switch to concurrent holiday (samtidighedsferie). Concurrent holiday basically means that the holiday earned during the year can be held on an ongoing basis.

When the new holiday act comes into force, you will be able to take holiday as you earn it – i.e. you earn 2.08 holidays per month, and it will be possible to take holiday in advance – i.e. before it is earned.

In general, there is no need to speculate in transferring holidays to 2020. If you have earned your full holiday entitlement, you will have 16.6 days of holiday at your disposal for the summer 2020 and special holidays will be added to this.

The transitional year runs from 1 September 2019 to 31 August 2020. The holiday you earn in the transitional year will be frozen and saved to a new fund – *Lønmodtagernes Fond for Tilgodehavende Feriemidler*. This is to prevent double entitlement when switching to concurrent holiday in 2020. You will receive the frozen holiday when you reach retirement age or leave the Danish labour market. Only holiday earned in the period 1 September 2019 to 31 August 2020 will be frozen in the fund. If you have transferred holiday, the transferred holiday will not be frozen.

## AU EVACUATE APP



As mentioned in previous issues of ECON News, AU has developed an evacuation app that sends out emergency alerts in critical situations where either specific buildings need to be evacuated, or where other critical circumstances require that a message must reach everyone in a specific area as fast as possible.

The app alerts you directly by means of an alarm sound on your smartphone, and keeps you updated on how the situation is developing, and it notifies you when the crisis is over. The app will also alert you when there is an evacuation drill.

All employees are encouraged to download the app on their smartphone – remember to allow push notifications (messages displayed on the phone screen regardless of whether the phone is locked or in use). The app is called "AU Evacuate" and can be downloaded in App Store or Google Play.

# Autumn 2019 and Spring 2020 Call for Proposals INDEPENDENT RESEARCH

The Independent Research Fund Denmark (IRFD) has published its call for proposals of independent research funds for the autumn 2019/spring 2020-round – see the call via the link below.

The autumn deadline for applications to IRFD|Social Sciences is 4 October 2019 at 12:00 noon for the following instruments:

- DFF Research Project 1 (up to DKK 2,000,000 excluding overheads),
- DFF Research Project 2 (up to DKK 4,300,000 excluding overheads)
- International Research Stay (DKK 300,000 excluding overheads)

For the International Postdoctoral Grant, the deadlines are 5 November 2019 at 12:00 noon and 26 March 2020 at 12:00 noon. And for the Sapere Aude Starting Grant, the deadline is 26 March 2020 at 12:00 noon.

<u>The Research Support Office at AU</u> offers assistance to IRFD applicants for the autumn 2019/spring 2020-round (see call above).

In order to offer the best possible assistance, the Research Support Office has made a plan for division of labour in collaboration with the project finance controllers for the IRFD-process:

- Research Project 1: The Research Support Office will read project proposals and draw up budgets.
- Research Project 2: The Research Support Office will read project proposals, and project finance controllers will draw up budgets for all Research Project 2 applications.
- International Research Stay: The Research Support Office will read project proposals, and project finance controllers will draw up budgets.

The internal deadline for notifying the Research Support Office that you would like support in relation to an IRFD-application is

Friday 23 August

At this deadline at the latest, please send an email to <u>Anne Marie Zwergius</u>: <u>amz@au.dk</u> specifying which IRFD instrument you are applying for and the assistance you will need.

If you do not meet this deadline, the Research Support Office cannot guarantee that they will be able to assist you.

After the internal deadline, the Research Support Office will contact the applicant with a plan for the individual support process. Regarding RP2-applications, the Research Support Office will facilitate the contact to a project finance controller, who will get in touch with the applicant regarding the budget.

## NORDFORSK CALL - INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH PROJECTS



NordForsk has sent out a call for proposals for their new Nordic programme for interdisciplinary research, which has a budget of NOK 120 million.

The call is specifically aimed at interdisciplinary projects that combine disciplines which rarely collaborate or that pursue an original research question requiring the exact combination of competencies from different disciplines. Projects awarded funding must include at least two of the following three areas: Life Science, Physical Sciences & Engineering, and Social Sciences and Humanities.

The maximum funding per project is NOK 15 million, and NordForsk hopes to fund 8 - 12 research projects under this call. Funding will be granted for up to four years, and successful proposals must include partners from at least three Nordic countries.

The deadline for submitting proposals is 13 November 2019.

## AUFF CALLS: NOVA GRANTS AND PUBLICATION SUPPORT



The Aarhus University Research Foundation (AUFF) has announced two calls for applications - for the AUFF Nova 2019 funding programme and for the AUFF Publication Support:

#### • AUFF Nova grants

The aim of AUFF Nova is to stimulate courageous and innovative research projects of high quality – projects which may have difficulties obtaining alternative funding. The project must be pioneering in its field and show clear potential for scientific breakthroughs. The hypothesis or problem behind the project may require development of new methods and it may challenge existing paradigms. If relevant, multi-disciplinary elements and synergies within the research team(s) should be clearly identified. The programme includes two types of grants:

- Small projects (up to DKK 600,000) with a duration of 1-2 years
- Large projects (up to DKK 3 million) with a duration of 3-4 years

The deadline for applications is 4 October at 12 noon.

#### AUFF Publication Support

The Aarhus University Research Foundation (AUFF) calls for applications for publication support.

The objective of the foundation's publication support is to ensure that important scientific work of a particularly high quality can obtain support for qualified high-quality publication and dissemination and thereby strengthen AU's communication of research results both within the international research landscape and to the general public.

The foundation assigns priority to ground-breaking publications with a special view to highly esteemed international channels of publication, mainly large international publishers.

Applicants must be employed at Aarhus University. Professors emeritus may also apply.

The 2019 pool for publication support comprises a total of DKK 1.5 million.

Deadline for applications is 4 September 2019 at 12 noon.

## FUNDING FOR COMPETENCE DEVELOPMENT



From 4 September you can apply for funding for individual competence development from the Agency for Competence Development in the State Sector (Den Statslige Kompetencefond).

The criteria as regards the nature of the activities to be funded and the amounts to be awarded will vary depending on the collective agreement under which you are employed. The fund was established as part of the collective agreement negotiations in 2018, and DKK 172 million has been earmarked for distribution among state sector employees until 2021.
